Course Description

This course will cover patient presentations that challenge care for patients with Ataxia. This includes a review of the anatomy and pathophysiology of the cerebellum, and the clinical presentation and assessment of ataxia. A description of the factors contributing to ataxia will be presented, along with ways to differentially discriminate between other movement disorders, and discussion of how to adjust physical therapy interventions to maximize outcomes with these patients.

- Identify and utilize standardized assessment measures to assess ataxia
- Describe the cerebellum's role in motor learning and motor control
