Please note that you may use this link **JUST ONCE** to access your network ID and password, so be sure to remember your information!

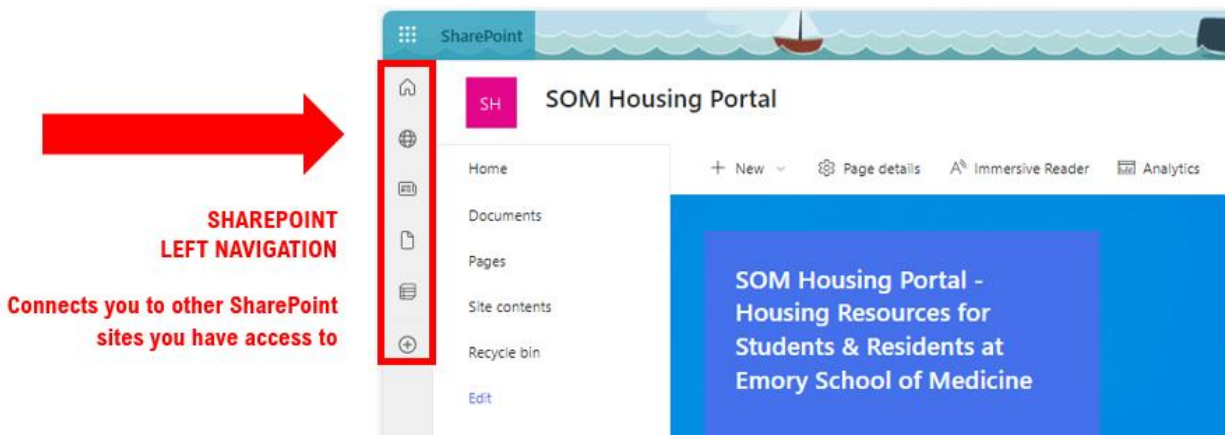
Logging In

After logging in, you should be on the Home page of the SOM Housing Portal. You will see several navigation (tool) bars.

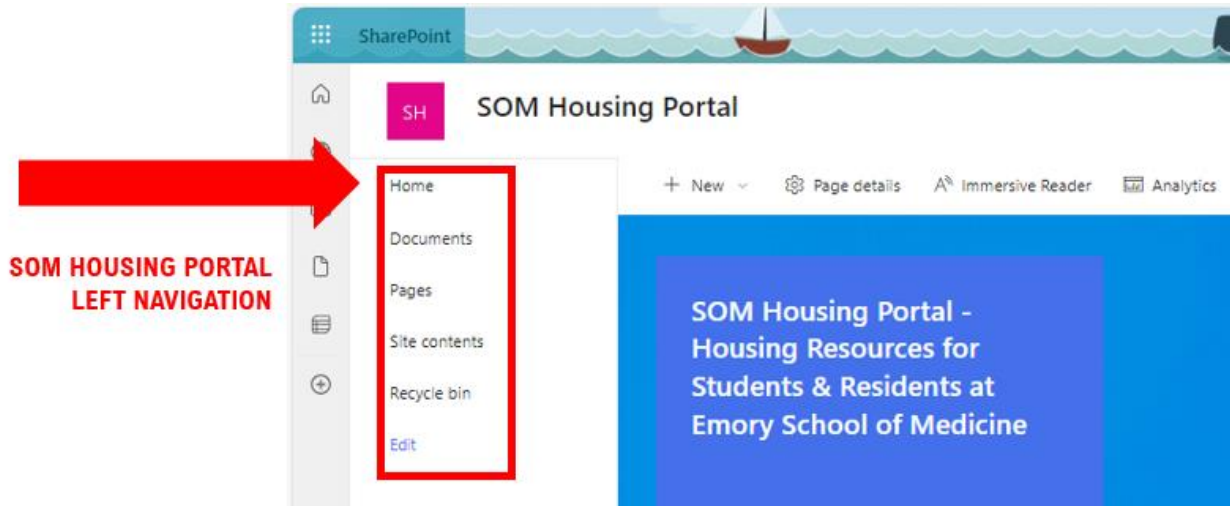
SharePoint Left Navigation

The “outer” left navigation bar is the SharePoint navigation tool. If you have access to other SharePoint sites, you can access them directly via this SharePoint navigation toolbar.



SOM Housing Portal Navigation

The “inside” left tool bar is your **SOM Housing Portal left navigation**.

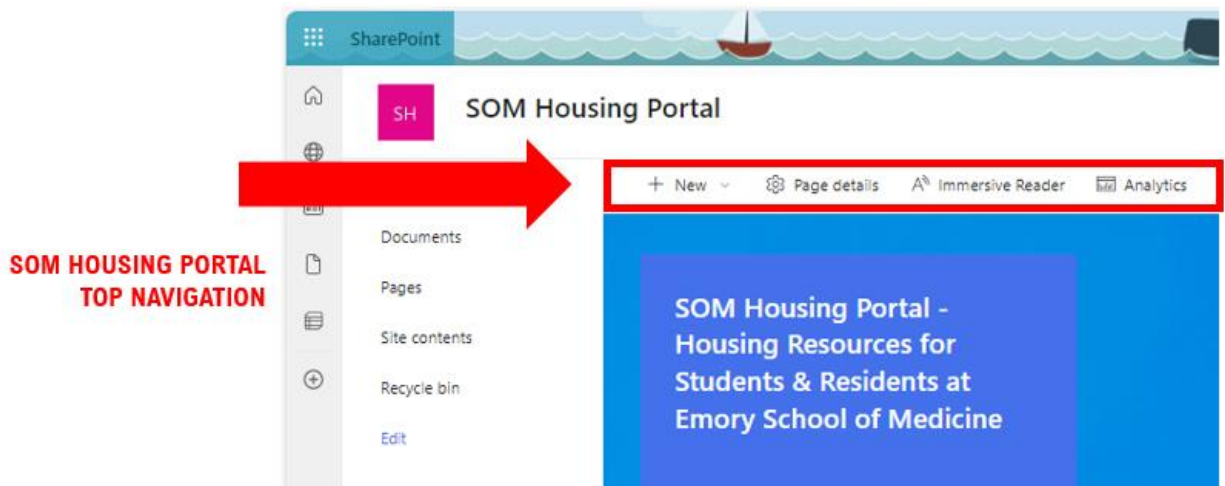


You should only need to use the **Home** page from this toolbar.
