He has been highly innovative in his leadership role in mHealth within the Dept. of BMI and has built strong collaborations within Morehouse School of Medicine and Georgia Tech



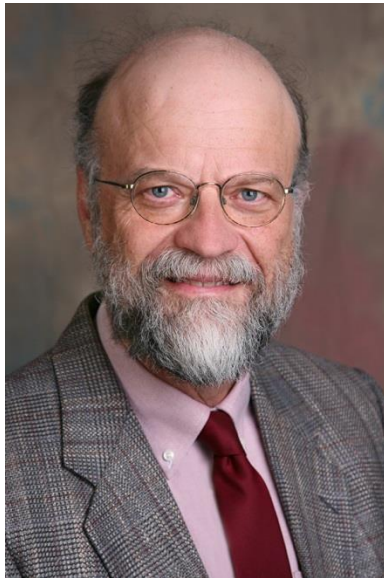
Jonathan Cohen, MD, MS
