Emory at Grady Innovation Award

The Emory at Grady Innovation Award has been established by the Emory at Grady Awards Committee to recognize faculty whose innovation in research, education, service, quality, or leadership has made a major impact at Grady. This award is created to identify and recognize faculty that have used creativity and innovation to improve patient care or trainee education by implementing new technology/procedures, making significant scientific discoveries, creating new operational processes, or pioneering new educational programs.

Deadline: Nominations will be accepted through **August 7, 2026**.

Eligibility: All current Emory faculty with at least 50% of their clinical, teaching, or research effort on the Grady campus. Eligible nominees will have exhibited extraordinary efforts that impact patients, families, communities, and trainees at the local, regional, and/or national level.

Examples include but are not limited to:

- Creative approaches to process and/or operational improvement
- Paradigm-shifting approaches for diagnosis, treatment, or disease prevention
- Novel programs or projects in care delivery, connectivity, and health promotion
- Pioneering educational programs and processes
- Groundbreaking scientific discoveries that address bold questions
- New, innovative technology/devices

Nominations: Faculty must be nominated by a faculty or staff member or a trainee of Emory University. The nomination should consist of a concise narrative (500 words or less) describing the nominee's innovation and the impact and the effect it has had.

Submission: Must be submitted using the [Online Nomination Form](#) and include the following:

- Nominating letter (500 words or less)
- Nominee's current Curriculum Vitae

Decision: Will be made by the Emory at Grady Awards Committee.

Award: The recipient of the Emory at Grady Best Colleague Award will be announced and honored at the annual Emory at Grady Awards Ceremony.
