PROGRAM OPPORTUNITIES

- Longitudinal mentorship including 1-2 month or 6-week clerkship experience
- Longitudinal mentorship with a faculty member and a resident
- End of rotation in-person interview with residency leadership and MUSE faculty
- Interview- virtual; standard interview day to scheduled via interview broker after ERAS application to the residency program
- Stipend: up to \$2000 stipend; living expenses for the month of clerkship experience
- Sponsored mentorship activities with mentors (meals covered)

- Submit your application to **muse@emory.edu** by May 30, 2022
- Rotation application through VLISO (formerly VSAS) at the appropriate time preceding/during 4th year
- Letter of interest/personal statement (1 page maximum) addressing:
 - Your interest in Emergency Medicine
 - Your interest in Emory University
 - What do you hope to gain from this experience?
 - What are your personal goals and objectives for this mentorship program?
 - Indicate how MUSE mentoring will benefit your future in relation to being under-represented in medicine
 - Elaborate on your experiences as under-represented in medicine (focusing on your ethnic background, cultural background, LGBTQ, religious background, etc.)
- CV
- Letter from Clinical Affairs Dean or designee confirming the student is in good standing
- Incomplete applications will not be considered
