

The Kathelen and Dan Amos Medical Student Loan Forgiveness Program:

IMPROVING ACCESS TO PRIMARY CARE IN GEORGIA

This debt forgiveness program allows Emory SOM students and graduates to practice primary care in Georgia without the financial strain that comes with lower-salary career paths.

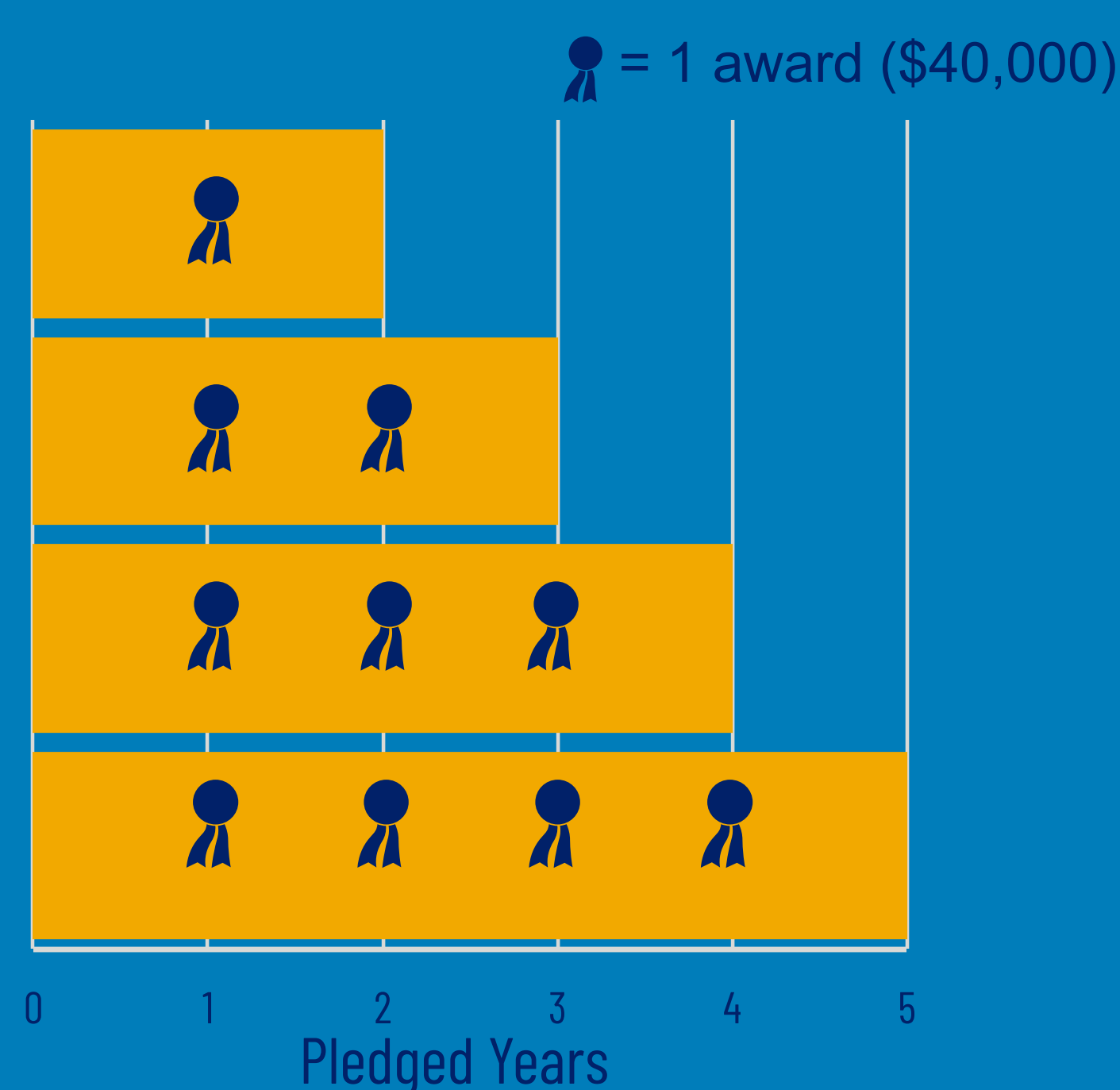


HOW IT WORKS:

This program offers single or multiple \$40,000 awards to eligible Emory SOM MD students, current FM, IM, Peds residents, and new Georgia-based physicians in primary care.

PLEDGE TO PRACTICE:

Recipients commit to 2-5 years of primary care practice in Georgia commensurate with the level of assistance they receive.



PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY:



Current Emory medical students who commit to residency training in a primary care field followed by primary care practice in Georgia



Recent School of Medicine graduates currently in residency training (internal medicine, family medicine, pediatrics or geriatrics) who pledge to remain in or return to Georgia for primary care practice



Given the pressing shortages of geriatricians in Georgia, this program extends additional eligibility to Emory Geriatrics fellows and fellowship graduates, regardless of their medical school affiliation
