

Grady and Midtown Excel at Racial Inclusion

In a newly released index, Grady ranks #8 and Emory Midtown ranks #10 in the country for success in serving people of color in their communities.

The Lown Institute Hospitals Index for Social Responsibility is the first rankings program to examine the racial inclusivity of America's hospitals. This is the fourth year racial inclusivity results have been released and the first time that data from Medicare Advantage has been included along with traditional Medicare claims. To create the rankings, the Institute assessed how well the demographics of a hospital's Medicare patients matched the demographics of the hospital's surrounding communities.
