**Bios:**

**Dr. Gavin Harris**

Dr. Gavin Harris is a faculty member at Emory University School of Medicine. He is dually appointed in Critical Care Medicine and Infectious Diseases with professional interests in disaster preparedness, rapid diagnostics, biosecurity, and the treatment of high consequence pathogens.

**Dr. Evan Anderson**

Evan J. Anderson is Professor of Pediatrics and Medicine at Emory University School of Medicine. He graduated summa cum laude from Wheaton College, IL after which he pursued his medical degree at the University of Chicago Pritzker School of Medicine. He remained at the University of Chicago for residency in both internal medicine and pediatrics before completing an adult and a pediatric infectious diseases fellowship at Northwestern Memorial and Children's Memorial Hospitals in Chicago. As such, he is board certified in internal medicine, adult infectious diseases, pediatrics and pediatric infectious diseases and splits his clinical care between adults and children. He moved from Northwestern to Emory University in 2012 where is an attending physician at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta in pediatric infectious diseases and Emory University Hospital in adult infectious diseases. He serves as the lead investigator in Georgia for influenza, RSV, and COVID-19 surveillance for the CDC-funded Emerging Infections Program. He is currently one of the multiple PIs of the Emory University Vaccine and Treatment Evaluation Unit (VTEU) and has been intricately involved with COVID-19 vaccine clinical trials in adults and children. He particularly enjoys mentoring trainees at all levels, and has nearly 200 total publications with particular interest in rotavirus, RSV, influenza, COVID-19, early phase vaccine clinical trials, and the power of community protection.

**Dr. Andi Shane**

Dr. Shane is a pediatric infectious disease physician who has a passion for the prevention of infectious disease in children both locally and internationally. Originally from South Africa, she has spent the last 15.5 years of her academic career at Emory University School of Medicine and Children's Healthcare of Atlanta.

She completed her undergraduate degree in the Biological Basis of Behavior at the University of Pennsylvania followed by completion of her MPH at the Mailman School of Public Health at Columbia University in New York City. Her medical education was completed at the Louisiana State University School of Medicine in New Orleans and her pediatric residency and chief residency at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine/ Montefiore in the Bronx, New York. Dr. Shane was an Epidemic Service Intelligence Officer at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention from 2001-3, a fascinating time to be in engaged in public health. She completed her pediatric infectious disease fellowship at the University of California, San Francisco. She was a KL2 recipient and completed her Master of Science in Clinical Research degree at Emory in 2009.

She currently divides her time among serving as the Division Chief of the Division of Pediatric Infectious Disease, her responsibilities as the Marcus Professor of Hospital Epidemiology and Infection Prevention for the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta system, caring for patients, performing clinical research, teaching, mentoring, and assisting with COVID-19 pandemic response.

### **Dr. John Horton**

Dr. Horton is from small town Louisiana, educated at LSU and trained at the University of Kentucky, Atlanta and Emory have been his home for more than a decade.

Dr. Horton sees both healthy pregnant patients looking for patient-centered care and people for regular yearly well person exams. He also engages pregnant patients who may have a complex medical background to help ensure they get the coordinated care they need. He performs surgery, including procedures to help decrease and manage abnormal bleeding, with balancing surgical options with medical care to give patients the options for care that works best for them and their lives.

As Department of Clinical Director of Operations and Division Director of General Obstetrics and Gynecology for Emory Healthcare Faculty, Dr. Horton works to create a cohesive experience at all practice sites. Our goal is to make sure people are cared for with respect and individualized attention that is coordinated through a single medical information and treatment system. Whether delivering a baby at one of our maternity centers or scheduling robotic surgery, our team works to communicate people's needs to provide compassionate care.

Dr. Horton grew up in a farm town of 2000 people and never lost a love of knowing neighbors and community. His love for the city drew him to Atlanta where he lives in Midtown with his partner, and they are in close proximity to the parks and all the activities Atlanta provides.
