Emory Heart Team Implants 500th Lifesaving Left Ventricular **Assist Device**


On July 29, a team from Emory's Heart and Vascular Center completed its 500th continuous flow, durable left ventricular assist device (LVAD) implantation. In 2022 alone, surgeons from Emory's advanced heart failure team implanted almost 60 devices by August, a number that continued to climb steadily. Emory Healthcare is the #1 LVAD implanting center in the United States, and this milestone further affirms our status as a national leader in the life-saving procedure.




Omar Lattouf, MD, PhD

Callie Medin and Emilie Warren receive ASCO Merit **Awards**

Dr. Medin and Dr. Warren will have the opportunity to present their abstracts at the 2023 American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO) GI Conference in January. Dr. Caroline Medin's study, titled "Neoadjuvant Chemoradiation Does Not Improve Outcomes for Patients Undergoing Resection for Upper Rectal Cancer: A US Rectal Cancer Consortium Analysis," is a retrospective cohort analysis that found that, among patients with non-metastatic upper rectal cancer who underwent surgical resection, neoadjuvant chemoradiation (NCRT) was not associated with improved survival or recurrence but was associated with a nearly threefold higher diverting loop ileostomy rate.

Dr. Emilie Warren's project, "A transanal minimally invasive surgical approach is associated with improved oncologic outcomes over conventional transanal excision for early-stage rectal cancer: An analysis of the US Rectal Cancer Consortium," found that for early-stage rectal cancers that undergo local excision, an MIS approach (TEM or TAMIS) was associated with a decreased rate of recurrence and improved recurrence-free survival, without any difference in perioperative complication rates.
