CRAIG COOPERSMITH SELECTED FOR 2023 ACCM DISTINGUISHED INVESTIGATOR AWARD



Craig Coopersmith, MD, FACS, MCCM, has been selected by the American College of Critical Care Medicine (ACCM) as the recipient of their 2023 ACCM Distinguished Investigator Award. This is the highest recognition given by the College, and is awarded to "an individual whose scientific and educational contributions to the art and science of critical care demonstrates career commitment and excellence." Dr. Coopersmith will be presented with his award during the combined ACCM Convocation/Society of Critical Care Medicine Awards Ceremony on January 22, 2023, and will give a brief presentation the following day.

Dr. Coopersmith is Vice Chair of Research in the Emory Department of Surgery, Program Director of the department's Surgical Critical Care Fellowship, and Director of the Emory Critical Care Center. He has established himself as one of the top investigators of sepsis and shock in the country, and was a member of an international task force of experts that redefined the terms "sepsis" and "septic shock" in 2016.


APPOINTMENTS


AWARDS & RECOGNITION


