



## Medical Education Residency Track

### Goals, Objectives, & Outcome

**Goals:** This **18-month track** will support residents to gain the knowledge, skills, and methods necessary to: (a) become scholarly teachers and (b) prepare them for careers as medical education scholars.

**Objectives:** Upon completion of this track, residents will be able to:

1. Describe the key principles of scholarly teaching
2. Develop and implement a lesson plan
3. Design a scholarly education project

**Outcome:** Upon completion of the track, residents will be awarded a certificate of completion and graduate with a distinction in Medical Education from Emory University School of Medicine.

### Components:

- **Core Curriculum**
  - Principles of Scholarly Teaching [Small Group Learning\*]
  - Medical Education Scholarship [Small Group Learning\*]
    - \*Small Group Learning sessions [Will typically occur monthly, on a Monday from 4:00-6:00PM].
    - Online intersessions activities [Will typically occur monthly, on a Monday from 5:00-6:00PM].
- **Experiential Learning**
  - Peer Teaching
  - Scholarly Project development
- **Capstone Project**
  - IRB Proposal Submission package
  - Implement Scholarly Project
  - Poster presentation at Emory Medical Education Day

- **Mentorship**
  - Teaching facilitator
  - Project Coach/Mentor

## **Application Process**

NOTE: Participation will be restricted to residents and fellows at the PGY-2 or higher level. Applications are due in the Spring (deadline of March 15) and are open to residents or fellows who will be PGY-2 or higher level as of July 1 of the same year.

The application must include the following components:

- A **personal statement** describing why you would like to participate in the residency track, your interest in Medical Education, and your expected goals and outcomes. The personal statement should be limited to no more than 1 page.
- A **brief letter of support from the Program Director**. A letter of support from the applicant's program director must be included as part of the application process. The letter should indicate support for the resident's participation in the Medical Education track.
