WHERE DO THE CANDIDATES STAND ON MENTAL HEALTH?

LOEFFLER/WARNOCK RUNOFF (listed alphabetically)



Kelly Loeffler supports a market-based approach to healthcare rather than a government-supported program like a public option or Medicare for all. She has co-sponsored two bills supporting veterans' mental health. She also serves on the board of Skyland Trail, a nonprofit treatment center for those navigating mental illness.*



Raphael Warnock supports access to affordable, quality mental health care through Medicaid expansion, early Medicare buy-in, and a public option. He supports increased resources for behavioral health treatment to decrease reliance on policing for non-criminal crisis interventions. He also has emphasized support for healthcare resources for women and children.*

OSSOFF/PURDUE RUNOFF (listed alphabetically)



John Ossoff supports public health insurance options for mental health care. He also supports funding rural hospitals and establishing new public health clinics to increase access to healthcare, including behavioral health services. He has asserted that individuals with mental illness who commit crimes should have access to healthcare interventions.*



David Purdue recommends lowering prescription drug costs and increasing access to healthcare through market-based solutions that increase competition; however, he has expressed support for non-profit community health centers that provide behavioral health services to underserved Georgians. He has also supported legislation for veterans' mental health.*
