


"The triple threat" **Department**

 - Professional Service
 - Teaching
 - Scholarship
 - At least Very Good* or Excellent in 2 areas
 - Senior rank promotion or appointment
 - Teaching Portfolio <u>mandated</u>

What is a Teaching Portfolio?

- Description of an instructor's major achievements in teaching
- Akin to an artist's portfolio: visual display of abilities, strengths and style

- Personal, self-selected, reflective



A <u>factual</u> description of:

- Teaching strengths (and weaknesses)
- Teaching accomplishments
- Evaluations
- Ideally?
 - Demonstrates <u>Progression</u> as an educator
 - Demonstrates <u>Leadership</u> as an educator




Question: How can you show progression as an educator?

What are the elements of the *Teaching Portfolio*?

 Description of educational activities in professional organizations

Regional, national, international

 Awards for outstanding performance in teaching and biomedical education

Departmental, SOM, University, Nat'l, Community

 Letters from former trainees evaluating the candidate's teaching

> Ask for them Save a 'feel good' file



 <u>List</u> of significant teaching materials prepared or edited

> ex: peer reviewed pubs, lab manual, webbased, OSCE cases, PBL, power-point, curriculum, syllabus

 List of Public service activities oriented to education


ex: brochures, community training, media opportunities

Photocopies of every slide presentation you've ever given

Disorganized, out of date, dog-eared, coffee stained random pieces of paper

Helpful Hints

Tips for Success

- Emory SOM format
- Separate service achievement from teaching
- Quantify your teaching time
- Scholarship of teaching
- Evaluations of your teaching
- Letters from former learners
- Documenting curricular improvement based on feedback

Formula for Failure

- Size <u>does</u> matter
 - Bigger not necessarily better but tiny not goodgo for Goldilocks
 - Inclusion of every slide you have ever created is a no-no
- Disorganized
- Impersonal
- Non-reflective
- Poor evaluations
