SPOTLIGHTS

FACULTY SPOTLIGHT: Paul Kim, MD, PhD

Last year Paul Kim joined the faculty as an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the School of Medicine. His primary role involves providing care to individuals who seek assistance at the Psychiatric Emergency Service (PES) at Grady Hospital.

What Paul finds particularly fulfilling in his current role at PES is the collaborative effort with the PES Core Team. Together, they strive to ensure patients receive timely care within a safe and supportive environment.

Before joining the faculty, Paul successfully completed his residency training in psychiatry at Emory. An integral part of his journey included participating in the research track at Emory, where he received invaluable support. This support significantly contributed to shaping his career as a clinician-scientist.

Beyond Paul's clinical responsibilities, he is actively engaged in laboratory work. His ongoing project focuses on developing a functional model of the blood-brain barrier in a dish. The ultimate goal is to establish a platform for testing potential therapeutics, reflecting his commitment to advancing research alongside clinical practice.

STAFF SPOTLIGHT: Cara Waiswilos

Cara Waiswilos has been a Licensed Professional Counselor for about five years. Currently, she is a clinical assessment specialist at the Emory Child and Adolescent Mood Program (CAMP). Essentially it means she does intake screenings

and coordination for new patients in the clinic, and also research assessments for a study about treatment for adolescents with depression.

Previously at Emory, Cara worked for the RadX team that trialed new over the counter Covid tests. Before coming to Emory, she worked at the Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency and a non-profit called Bobby Dodd Institute as a Certified Rehabilitation Counselor assisting people with disabilities to access the work place. She also has previous therapeutic work experience at an inpatient psychiatric hospital, a PHP/IOP clinic for adolescents and a methadone clinic.

Cara likes so many things about her job at CAMP. First of all, she feels camaraderie with her coworkers. She values the importance of the work CAMP does and its impact on the future generations of our community. Lastly, she appreciates the work/life balance.

Prior to getting her masters in counseling, Cara worked for ten years in various roles of healthcare administration, specifically skilled nursing facilities and hospice.

Outside of work, Cara volunteers as a Court Appointed Special Advocate for children in foster care with Fulton County. She loves to travel, and in 2023 took trips to Amsterdam and Morocco. In 2024, she has a tentative plan to visit to Greece.
