
## **Morning Meetings**

Morning Meetings were developed as a part of the Responsive Classroom model. It is designed to (1) set a tone for respectful learning, (2) establish a climate of trust, (3) motivate students to feel significant, (4) create empathy and encourage collaboration, and (5) support social, emotional and academic learning. Students and teacher gather together, usually in a circle, for an organized start-of-day activity. Morning Meetings can be as auick as 10 minutes or as long as 30. There are four key components:



## **Keys for Successful Implementation of Morning Meetings**

- 1. Adapt it to your classroom.
  - a. Have an afternoon meeting if your schedule doesn't allow the time in the morning
  - b. Set goals for the day based on your students' social and behavioral needs
- 2. Ensure structure.
  - a. Have rules that remind students that activities follow a pattern and everyone benefits by the structure
  - b. Have a time limit
- 3. Set expectations.
  - a. Encourage collaboration
  - b. Have only one student speak at a time, to show respect and reinforce speaking and listening skills
  - c. Support students to speak in complete sentences with rich and robust words
