Scripts

What is a Script?

A script message/set of messages, or phrases or sentences that provide the language that goes into a specific conversation. They can involve conversation starters, the content of a topic, responses to conversations and/or ideas that connect conversations. Scripts can help speakers appropriately change topics, ask questions, be the leader, be the speaker, or finish/terminate conversations appropriately.

Ideas for Script Topics:

Lunch Time Talk Asking for Help Greetings & Hallway Talk Initiating and Maintaining Play Show & Tell My Favorite Things & What are Yours? What I did in School (over the weekend, for summer vacation, etc.)

Steps for Script Implementation:


- 1. Explicitly teach the script to the learner
- 2. Practice using the script with the identified communication partners
 - a. Hold up the script behind the communication partner so the learner can read the appropriate responses
 - b. Prompt the learner to use the script using a most-to-least hierarchy
 - c. Model the appropriate response to the communication partner
- 3. Fade prompts to read the script
- 4. Fade the script


