

Daily Overview (April 24, 2020)

We continue efforts at addressing potential surge conditions, and have begun discussions about a coordinated thoughtful ramp-up of outpatient operations.

Safety:

- COVID-19 antibody testing is now available to EHC employees, providers, and house staff.
- For EHC sites wearing a mask is expected whenever in patient care areas, elevators, hallways, and common areas, such as lobbies and cafeterias. This also applies to staff breakrooms and in-person meetings where social distancing of six feet or more cannot be accommodated.
- Grady wearing of a mask is mandatory.

Methods:

- We have begun planning a safe ramp-up of outpatient imaging in close collaboration with key referring services. Initial steps include assessment of waiting room spaces, imaging modality cycle times, hours of operation, and PPE needs.
- Initial planning around interventional radiology and breast imaging ramp-up is taking place.

Equipment:

- We have deployed units for UV sterilization of N95 masks and have finalized protocols for in-department versus hospital-entity level sterilization.

Supplies:

- Supply levels, including of PPE, are holding steady at sufficient levels.

Staffing:

- We continue monitoring a dashboard of patient and imaging volume metrics to predict and prepare for surge conditions and manage recovery.

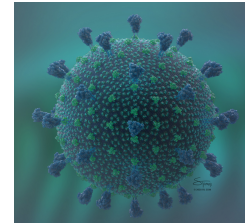
